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# “A Season of Beginning”

In *The Great Gatsby*, F. Scott Fitzgerald wrote, “Life starts all over again when it gets crisp in the fall.” Truman Capote wrote, in *Breakfast at Tiffany’s*, “Aprils have never meant much to me, autumns seem the season of beginning, spring.” And this from Nora Ephron: “Don’t you love New York in the fall? It makes me want to buy school supplies. I would send you a bouquet of sharpened pencils if I knew your name and address.”

At The Brick Presbyterian Church, fall truly is the season of beginning! We are very excited about all of the opportunities planned for worship, education, mission, and of course fellowship. ## MINISTERS’ READING CORNER

### What Kimberly Clayton has been reading:

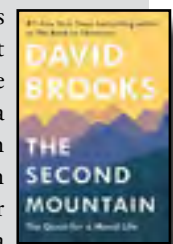

**Psalm Studies** In preparation for the Women’s Bible Study this fall, I’m reading several books on the Psalms. J. Clinton McCann, Jr. is an internationally known Psalms scholar. He teaches at Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis, MO. We will use his *Immersion* study guide on the Psalms. I am reading a second book he wrote, *Great Psalms of the Bible*, for supplemental ideas. I am also re-reading two older books on the Psalms: a slim book by Dietrich Bonhoeffer (more a reflection on prayer in our lives than a study of the Book of Psalms), and another by C. S. Lewis, *Reflections on the Psalms*, first published in 1958. Here, Lewis says, he writes not as a biblical scholar but as one ‘amateur’ to another: “sharing difficulties I have met or lights I have gained when reading the Psalms.” As one might expect of Lewis, there are beautiful insights beautifully stated scattered throughout.



### *The Second Mountain: The Quest for a Moral Life* by David Brooks

This newly published book by New York Times columnist, David Brooks in some ways builds upon his earlier book on character. Through the experiences of deep change in his own life, Brooks describes life as having a “two-mountain shape.” When we first start out as adults, we climb the first mountain, which is made of those things our culture values—success, making a name for ourselves, personal happiness. Once we reach that summit, we realize there is more to life and we begin to climb the “second mountain.” Brooks explores the four commitments that define a life of meaning and purpose: to a spouse and family, to a vocation (not necessarily the same thing as our ‘job,’ to a philosophy or faith, and to a community. He shares how, in his own “second mountain” journey, his faith has deepened as his Jewish heritage and appreciation for Jesus, the Gospels, and the Christian faith now are joined, enriching his engagement with people and the world around him.

## BRICK CHURCH SCHOOL ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

(PLEASE NOTE THE APPLICATION DEADLINE IS DEC. 1)



Children who will be three years old by Nov. 30, 2020 are eligible for admission to the Brick Church School in Sept. 2020. The Brick Church School also has a two's program for siblings and the children of Church members. Children must be two by **Sept. 1, 2020**. You may submit an application online after Labor Day from the School's website at [www.brickchurchschool.org](http://www.brickchurchschool.org). Applications will be available from September through November, so you do not need to contact us the first day after Labor Day. All applications (2s and 3s) must be received by **Dec. 1**.

### The Session has approved the following Guidelines for Admission:

The Brick Church School recognizes the importance of diversity in its student body and also seeks balance in each classroom in terms of gender, age and personalities. To this end, it welcomes children of members and non-members of the Church of all racial, ethnic, religious and other backgrounds. However, in accepting candidates for admission, the School will give preference to:

- Children of parents, be they Church members or non-members, who require scholarship assistance to fulfill the Brick Church's goal to have at least 10% of the students receive financial assistance.

- Children of active members of the Brick Church who joined the Church at least a full year prior to the Dec. 1 application deadline. [The Constitution of The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Part II, Book of Order 1999-2000, Section G-5.0202 defines an active member as a "person who has made a profession of faith in Christ, has been baptized, has been received into membership of the church ... and participates in the church's work and worship." Earlier in the Book of Order {Section G-5.0102 (d.)}, it states that financial support is an important part of being a faithful member, and the Brick Church requires a timely stewardship pledge and payment as part of financial support.]

- Siblings of non-member children who are or have been enrolled in the school.

In every instance, admissions decisions will be made by the School to preserve the best interests of the students and the quality of their educational experience both as individuals, as members of a particular class or grade, and as members of the student body of the School as a whole. Therefore, while preference will be given to the aforementioned applicants, preferential consideration will not guarantee admission.

"Information for Church Members Interested in Applying to The Brick Church School" is available on the website. This more fully explains what active membership means. By **Dec. 2**, Church members who have been members for more than a year and parents of siblings must choose if they would like to have preference status. If they so choose, they will receive an early decision from the School by **Jan. 17** and will need to reply to the School by noon on **Jan. 24**. Once committing to The Brick Church School, families must withdraw from other schools. Decisions for members less than two years and for all other candidates will be mailed on **Feb. 27**.





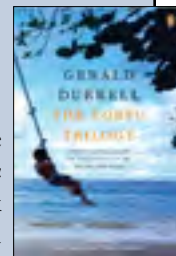
## CHILDREN'S FAIR: SAVE THE DATE FRIDAY, OCT. 18 — NOON TO 4 P.M.
